Her major teaching areas are: research methods in social sciences; elite and leadership studies; Europeanization.

Area of Expertise: Political sociology; public policy process.

Research interest: Concepts of security; political elites and civil society (in Lithuania, in Central Eastern Europe, in Belarus); coalition governments (in Lithuania, in the EU); perception of threats; politics of memory; gender mainstreaming; electoral campaigns (on national and supranational level).
